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# TURQUOISE THURSDAY SHEDS LIGHT ON CERVICAL CANCER DISPARITIES AMONG AMERICAN INDIAN/ALASKA NATIVE WOMEN DURING NATIONAL CERVICAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH

SAINT PAUL, MN — In the United States, early detection and screening have greatly reduced the impact of cervical cancer among all women. However, cervical cancer continues to disproportionately affect Native communities and Native women are over 1.5 times as likely to develop cervical cancer compared to White women.

Join the fight against Indigenous cervical cancer burdens by turning Indian Country turquoise and spreading the word about the American Indian Cancer Foundation's Turquoise Thursday campaign this January during National Cervical Health Awareness Month. Take action by encouraging your relatives with a cervix to receive the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine and take the <u>Turquoise Thursday Pledge</u> by scheduling a Pap smear — two crucial steps in combating cervical cancer.

HPV is an infection that can cause cervical, throat, penile, anal, and vulvar cancers. Immunization is recommended for both children and adults to help prevent 90% of HPV-causing cancers. The HPV vaccine helps protect against cervical cancer, one of the most preventable and treatable forms of cancer, when detected early.

Support your relatives who have committed to raising cervical cancer awareness with AICAF. Throughout January, ten(10) Clinic Champions and one cervical cancer survivor are partnering with us to raise awareness about the Turquoise Thursday campaign across Indian Country.

AICAF is honored to partner with Indigenous cervical cancer survivor, Mary Ann Cook (Red Lake Ojibwe) as our 2024 Turquoise Thursday Campaign Advocate. Follow AICAF's social media throughout the month as we share inspiring messages from Mary. Check out her survivor story here.

Our Clinic Champions are Tribal and Urban Indian Clinics that were selected through an application process to receive a \$500 micro grant. Clinic Champions were chosen for their innovative, community-based interventions that engage community members in working towards effective and sustainable cervical cancer solutions.

The Nebraska Urban Indian Medical Center plans to organize an in-person event focused on raising awareness about cervical cancer. It will include education on cervical cancer and HPV screening, along with providing food and support like transportation and child care. Incentives will be given to encourage participation and completion of screenings. The target audience includes individuals due for screenings and anyone interested in learning more. The initiative also aims to involve medical providers and assistants to emphasize the importance of screening. Additionally, they plan to use broadcast text messaging to easily connect with patients and spread awareness.

The Wewoka Indian Health Clinic plans to host various cervical cancer awareness events throughout the month to raise cervical cancer awareness in their community. They will offer community education, incentives, food and schedule screenings at their upcoming "Pap-a-thon" and HPV/STI events.
